By the time I was four years old, it had become clear to my family that I wasn't a big fan of the Christmas morning surprise. As I got older, my methods for finding and discerning the contents of brightly wrapped packages became more sophisticated. Tape measures, nail files, slightly wet sponges, a portable spotlight (used to illuminate the decorations in front of our house—when it wasn't being used to provide a primitive x-ray of the writing on the side of a carton); these were the tools of discovery employed during afterschool and late-night gift hunts. In frustration, or perhaps as a humbling demonstration of his superior cunning, my father began asking co-workers to take my presents to their homes until Christmas Eve. Secret deliveries were arranged while I was at church. I never saw myself as a “problem child!”

Some people like surprises. They enjoy opening up a package and being unaware of what might be inside. It enhances the experience of receiving a gift—so they say. Bah! Humbug!

Surprises come in all shapes and forms. Some are pleasant and joyous, bringing an unexpected blessing or bonus to our lives. Sometimes, they are unpleasant and unsettling. Some are little gifts that barely register in our minds. Some will rock your world, for better or for worse.

Part of the joy of the holiday season is the element of surprise. With each passing Christmas and New Year's Day, I have come to appreciate

and chosen servant who would restore their tiny, battered nation to prominence and lift the yoke of foreign rule off their weary shoulders. What they got was, well, a surprise.



Throughout his life, Jesus was examined, questioned, challenged, pushed and prodded. Could this itinerant preacher from the backwoods of Nazareth be the One? Some saw through the plain wrapping and caught a glimpse of the holy. Others had no ability to perceive the priceless gift that God had set before them. For some, he was too good to be true—the Word made flesh. For most, however, he wasn't good enough. And he wasn't what they had expected. They weren't interested. No surprises, please.



No one disputes the adage that “perception is reality.” Our expectations can sharpen our senses to the joyous surprises in life, or they can completely debilitate us, rendering us unaware and unresponsive to even the most moving of events. If we come to each new day, and the dawning of a new year, with childlike anticipation and a determination to perceive God's grace in the smallest and largest of things, we won't be disappointed; no matter what happens.

Our plan is to meet at Calvary at 4:00 PM to head to our first home and then be back at the church at 7:15 PM for dessert.

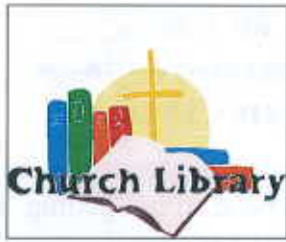

## CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NEWS



Max Lucado loves words – written, spoken – it does not matter. After 25 years of writing, Lucado has accomplished more than most writers hope

for in a lifetime. Most of his books have appeared on one or more best seller lists. Max is the only author to have won three Christian Book of the Year awards in 1999 for *Just Like Jesus*, in 1997 for *In the Grip of Grace*, and in 1995 for *When God Whispers Your Name*.

Max's writings have been published in a wide array of formats including adult books, gift books, children's titles, Bibles, commentaries, calendars and devotionals. He is also the author/creator of "Max Lucado's Hermie & Friends", one of the most popular animated DVD series in the marketplace.

Lucado was born in 1955 in San Angelo, Texas, and raised in Andrews, Texas, the youngest of four children. Lucado went through a period of rebellion against his parents' values and their God during his teens and into college. But it wasn't long before he found himself drawn back to his roots, back to God. He married, spent time serving as a missionary in Brazil, and returned to the States, where he began working as a church minister and writing on the side.

From all accounts, Max Lucado is not a man consumed by sales, awards, and achievements. He spends the bulk of his week serving as Minister of Preaching at Oak Hills Church in San Antonio, where he has served since 1988.

If you are interested in reading one of Lucado's many books, Calvary library has numerous books for both adults and children by this author. A few examples are listed here. In our children's section we have *God Thinks You're Wonderful!*,

*You Are Special, A Hat For Ivan, and Best of All.* In our adult section you will find *The Great House of God, Just Like Jesus, When Christ Comes, In The Eye of the Storm, and The Angels Were Silent.*
